# We value **COMMUNITAS**:

As a community we will seek to love God with all of our heart, mind, soul and strength and our neighbors as ourselves. We voluntarily sacrifice and surrender our selfish desires and ambitions in order to accomplish the mission. #### **SERVICES PROVIDED**

KidZone Learning Center will accept children 6 weeks old through elementary school age and will not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender, religion, or disability status in the provision of service.

#### **Hours of Operation:**

KidZone Learning Center will be open from 6:30AM to 6:00PM, Monday through Friday.

#### **Available Programs:**

- Full-Time Child Care is available for children 6 weeks through elementary school age.
- Preschool Only Program:

**5-Day Preschool** (3—5 yr old) M-F 8:30 AM—11:30 AM **3-Day Preschool** (3—5 yr old) M-W-F 8:30 AM—11:30 AM **2-Day Preschool** (3—5 yr old) T-Th 8:30 AM—11:30 AM

- Part-Time Child Care (less than 5 hours per day) may be available for children 6 weeks through elementary school age, depending on openings.
- Drop-in care for K—Elementary age children (see Daycare Director for more information)

#### **Meal Service:**

#### **Full-time Students:**

- Two nutritious snacks (AM & PM) and lunch daily.
- Breakfast for students is an optional service for an additional charge, if prearranged. Breakfast is served between 7:00AM—7:30 AM only.

#### "Preschool Only" Students:

- Morning snack
- The lunch hour (11:30AM to 12:30PM) is available to "Preschool Only" Students for an additional fee.

Our state-governed food program requires that all children eat the food provided by the center. Exceptions to the provided food service are only for children with food allergies or religious specifications, therefore we would ask that food not be sent with your child.

Because we are regulated to have two hours between each snack and lunch period, children must eat at our specified eating times when at KidZone Learning Center.

Please note that we will never force a child to eat or withhold food from a child for any reason.

#### **Curriculum:**

Biblically based curriculum is a major component of our teaching program, and we take great pride in offering the finest in early learning experiences. Children will be engaged in literature rich activities, basic skill development, beginning Spanish and Sign language, reading readiness experiences, basic number skills, and introduction to computers. Our education base will provide your student with the necessary kindergarten readiness skills.

#### **Child Performance Programs:**

KidZone Learning Center plans for two center-wide programs a year where the KidZone Learning Center children are showcased. Our performance programs are for all our children, including the infants and toddlers.

The two KidZone Learning Center programs are:

- December—Christmas Program
- May—Preschool Graduation & Spring Program

Individual class programs may be added throughout the year.

#### **Off-Site Field Trips:**

KidZone Learning Center plans for two off-site field trips a year. Our off site field trips are for children in the 2 ½ year classes and up.

The two off-site field trips are:

- Fall—Pumpkin Patch
- Spring—Deanna Rose Children's Petting Zoo

Individual class off-site field trips may be added throughout the year.

#### **KidZone Student & Family Pictures:**

In the fall and spring of each year, KidZone Learning Center provides the opportunity for our students and their families to have photos taken. Purchase of photos is optional. KidZone Learning Center will use this opportunity to obtain a current photo of each child for the child's records.

## LOVING GUIDANCE & DISCIPLINE POLICY

In as much as we understand preschool age children are at an innocent age, we realize that they must also become responsible for their actions. However, the KidZone Learning Center will never use any form of discipline that is physical, harsh, demeaning or embarrassing to a child.

Our first step for good discipline is to provide a well organized pleasant environment that will offer children numerous choices of activities. This can help to ensure that children are engaged in constructive behaviors and can often prevent problems from happening in the first place.

When issues arise, we will attempt to redirect the child or children away from the conflict to a more appropriate choice. If this does not correct the situation, the child or children may be asked to sit out for a brief period of calming down time—called time-out. (For toddlers, the TOY or item causing inappropriate behavior may be put in time-out). The teacher will then lovingly talk to each child about what happened and then ask them to make a better choice. If they still appear to be upset or are not able to show self control other measures will be taken to settle the situation. Perhaps visiting another classroom or teacher will provide a welcome relief to diffuse the tension. If these measures are not effective the parents may be called to speak to their child and offer some reassuring words or ideas, or perhaps asked to come and pick them up for the day.

If aggressive, hurtful behavior continues, a conference with the parents may be requested to discuss a positive action plan of behavior modification that both parties agree upon.

Children who are physically and/or verbally abusive to themselves, other children, the teachers or the equipment may be asked to leave the center. Upon the first overt display of behavior the parents will be called to come and pick up the child immediately. For the safety of everyone at KidZone Learning Center, continued behavior of this kind can result in permanent dismissal from our program.

Parents are encouraged to call or stop by anytime to visit their child's classroom. Also the child's lead teacher's cell phone number is made available to the parent for texting/calls. We encourage our parents/guardians to have regular communication with the child's lead teacher.

We want to have a combined effort of parent/guardian, teacher, and child all working together to provide the best learning environment possible.

We will always strive to help your child grow and mature emotionally, intellectually, socially, and spiritually to become the loving citizen God created them to be.

#### **IMPORTANT ITEMS TO NOTE**

#### **Absence or Late Arrival:**

If for any reason, your child will not be in attendance or will be arriving later than their scheduled time, parents/guardians must call the KidZone Learning Center at (913) 780-6365 no later than 8:30 AM to notify the center of the absence. Parents/guardians may also notify their child's lead teacher by sending a text message.

#### **Calendar:**

The Center's Monthly Activities Calendar will be sent home with your child on the first of each month. The calendar can also be found on the KidZone Learning Center web page at www.olathewesleyan.org.

#### **Outdoor Recess Guidelines:**

We feel it is important to the health and well-being of the children to have outside play time. All students are expected to participate in recess. Students should be prepared for the sudden changes in Kansas weather. Generally, if a child is too sick to go outside for recess, he/she is too sick to be in school. There may be exceptions to this rule, but the outdoor recess policy is as follows:

There will be no outdoor recess when:

- The temperature is 20 degrees F. (-13 C.) or below
- The wind chill index is 20 degrees F. (-13C.) or below
- There is significant falling moisture.
- The heat index is at the extreme caution level.

#### **Exclusion Recommendations:**

A child may not be in attendance at KidZone Learning Center if he/she presents one of the following symptoms (as stated by Johnson County Health Department).

#### **Safety Drills:**

**Fire Safety Drills will be conducted monthly**. Children will be escorted from the building, pass through the fenced in playground and cross the back yard to the wooden fence on the west perimeter of the property. Teachers will immediately take attendance. After the "all clear" signal is given, teachers and children may re-enter the building.

**Tornado Safety Drills will be conducted monthly, April through September.** Teachers will escort the children to the basement of KidZone Learning Center via the stairwells. Children will get down on their knees next to the exterior walls, bend over, and place their hands on the back of their heads for protection. Teachers will escort the children back to their classrooms when the "all clear" has been given.

In the event of an Extreme Emergency requiring the evacuation of the building, teachers will escort their class to the Oak Ridge Apartment's Clubhouse for safety. Parents will immediately be notified of the situation via phone/text and/or email.
